Take your child to a general practitioner immediately if they have:

- Unexplained weight loss or fever
- Lumps or swellings (without pain or infections)
- Pallor, bruising or bleeding
- Persistent fatigue or headache
- General bone pain



Signs and symptoms of leukemia include:

- Fever
- Frequent infections
- Weakness
- Fatigue
- Easy bleeding and bruising
- Pain in bones and joints



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Be aware of the early signs and symptoms of brain and spinal tumours

- headaches
- developmental delays
- increase in head circumference in infants
